The medical care on Saba is supplied by the Saba Cares Foundation in The Bottom.

We offer 24/7 emergency service with our ER and ambulances. Our Clinic has a team of Island Physicians, Physician Assistants and Nurses to tend to our patients.

In addition to our Island Physicians, visiting specialists and paramedics have monthly or bimonthly clinics at our medical center.

The Home Health team delivers nursing care to our community in their own homes. We also provide medical transport services for non-emergency ZJCN approved transportation.

Our admission ward allows us to admit patients who need hospitalized care and our facility is fitted with radiology and ultrasound.

We have our own laboratory where seventy percent of tests are completed on island, the others are sent out and completed off island at St. Maarten Laboratory Services.
